"The Light of Easter: A Time of Faith, Hope, and Togetherness"

Easter is the greatest and most joyful celebration in Orthodox Christianity. In Greek, Easter is called "Pascha," a word derived from the Hebrew "Pesach," meaning "The Passage." For Christians worldwide, it signifies the resurrection of Christ and the passage from death to eternal life.

To prepare for Easter and Christ's resurrection, Christians observe a 50-day fast known as "Sarakosti." This period of spiritual and physical discipline reflects the faithful's desire to partake, in some way, in Jesus Christ's sacrifice for humanity and to express their gratitude.

Easter and Holy Week begin on the first Sunday after the full moon, on or after the Vernal Equinox. The most significant days of Holy Week are Friday and Saturday. Holy Friday commemorates the culmination of Christ's Passion, including the "Pieta" and His burial. In the early hours, churches open their doors for the faithful to gather and decorate the "Epitaphios," a symbolic representation of Christ's tomb.

On Holy Saturday, priests wear white robes and scatter rose petals while chanting psalms in His honor, preparing for the glorious news of Christ's resurrection. At midnight, when the faithful have gathered at the church, the celebration begins. The priests share the Holy Light with Christians worldwide and chant "Christos Anesti" (Christ is Risen), spreading the joyous message of Christ's resurrection.
